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School vision:

At Toynton-All-Saints Primary School, we strive to enable all children to thrive, where we aim for excellence and to prepare each individual child to be ready to take on the challenges and opportunities that the world has to offer. This targeted and strategic use of PE and Sports Grant Funding will support us in achieving this vision for the period 2014-2015.

This year Toynton-All-Saints Primary School has received a lump sum of £8,454. The funding must be spent on Physical Education and Games and will be surveyed by Ofsted.

We work with 16 other local schools, through The Greenwood Dale Foundation Trust in Skegness, who provide inter-schools sports experiences and competitions, such as rowing, tag rugby and football. In addition, we have used some of the funding to work with JB Sports, who have organised termly inter-schools sports competitions; including netball, quicksticks hockey, cricket, football and Summer sports events. Within our local schools' collaboration ("The Fantastic 5") we have taken part in additional netball and football competitions.

At the beginning of each day, we hold a 5 minute exercise programme for the whole school, to warm the children up for the day's learning. Throughout the year, we run Extended Schools clubs across the key stages, offering football, tennis, cricket, tag rugby, hockey and athletics. We have an external Football Coach who trains with the Key Stage 2 children each week and we have two GB Qualified Archery Instructors, who are taking the children through their GB Olympic qualifications throughout the year.

In the Summer term, the children from Years 3 to 6 take part in a programme of 6 swimming lessons, wherein they receive their certificates of competence at the end of each programme.

We continue to fund our Conservation Area as a Forest School learning area, in the provision of Outdoor and Adventurous Activities, Orienteering, team building and leadership challenges.

Following our audit of PE we have invested in new PE equipment, such as hockey sticks and footballs to support teaching and learning throughout the key stages and for active playtimes. We plan to continue to invest in key equipment over the forthcoming year.
