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School vision:

At Toynton-All-Saints Primary School, we strive to enable all children to thrive, where we aim for excellence and to prepare each individual child to be ready to take on the challenges and opportunities that the world has to offer. This targeted and strategic use of PE and Sports Grant Funding will support us in achieving this vision for the period 2013-2014.

This year Toynton-All-Saints Primary School has received a lump sum of £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil per annum. The funding must be spent on Physical Education and Games and will be surveyed by Ofsted at the end of the first year.

With some of the funding, we have joined with some 16 other local schools, working collaboratively alongside The Greenwood Dale Foundation Trust in Skegness to provide an exciting Sports Curriculum for our children and our staff. Through this partnership for this academic year, all of our children from our Little Acorns aged 3 to our Year 6s aged 11, will have access to specialist Sports Coaches in the fields of Gymnastics, Multi-Skills, Hockey, Archery and Athletics. Our NQT P.E. Co-ordinator will attend CPD sessions to enable us to improve our professional skills, knowledge and understanding to enable us to offer Outstanding PE and Games provision for our Foundation Stage, KS1 and KS2 children in such areas as Dance and Gymnastics training with Val Sabin. The P.E. Co-ordinator will in turn, deliver internal PE and Sports training with our Teaching Team, so building their confidence in delivering age appropriate provision. We will extend a 1.15 hour per week Extended Sports Club to all children from Year 1 to Year 6 for 39 weeks.

In addition to the partnership Extended School Club, we will offer an additional Football Club each week for 1.15 hours for all children from Years 3 to Years 6.

Every opportunity will be seized to enable our children to take part in inter-schools' competitions through the Coastal Partnership.

Following our audit of PE we have identified the need to increase resources to support teaching and learning throughout the key stages and for active playtimes. The audit has also identified a need for Extended Hours sporting opportunities for children in Key Stage 1. We aim to continue to use our Conservation Area next year in the provision of Outdoor and Adventurous Activities, Orienteering and Forest School challenges, which will be reported when finalised before the end of the academic year.
